Trips will include Brunel's ground-breaking engineering works and the much admired Georgian architecture of the city of Bath.

The programme starts on Thursday with an informal dinner in the Pomegranate Restaurant. The next day members have the option of a full day trip to the world famous SS Great Britain and the Clifton Suspension bridge with lunch in the Clifton Club or an afternoon guided walk through the UNESCO World Heritage city centre. On Saturday morning the options are a visit to the gardens and house of the American Museum a short distance from the city. This has spectacular views of the Avon Valley. Then on to a riverside lunch at the Bathwick Boatman. That afternoon another guided walk this time focussing on the arts and literature of the city – think Jane Austen.

Another connection with Jane Austen. Our Induction Ceremony will be held in the church where her father was both married and buried – St Swithin's Walcot.

Our Gala Dinner that evening will be held in the UNESCO World Heritage Roman Baths and Pump Room. The weekend concludes with a Farewell lunch at The Architect.

Providing encouragement and help to the less fortunate in life, particularly in the hospitality industry, is one of our charitable aims and we will celebrate this with a grand raffle at the Gala Dinner in support of The Clink.

In the Chaîne tradition the teams in all these venues have planned great menus reflecting both location and time of year and you are ensured to leave saying 'wow'.

he City of Bath, although not large, is exceptional in having two UNESCO World Heritage Site listings. In 1987 it was listed for its Hot Springs, Roman archaeology, Georgian buildings and natural landscape setting. In 2021 a second listing was received as one of the Great Spa Towns of Europe – fashionable spa towns laid out around natural springs which are used for health and wellbeing.

The City was also for many years the home of the famous author, Jane Austin and we are fortunate to be visiting this year on the 250th anniversary of her birth.










WELCOME DINNER


CITY OF BATH GUILDHALL

The Welcome Dinner will be held in the Grade One listed Georgian Guildhall in the centre of the city. This has been made possible by the kind permission of the city authorities. The building was designed by Thomas Baldwin on the site of previous Guildhalls and completed

in 1778. It has been the centre of the city's political activities and life since that date. The evening starts with the reception in the Brunswick Room on the ground floor before processing upstairs to the splendid Banqueting Hall for dinner.



Saturday 20 September AMERICAN MUSEUM AND BATHWICK BOATMAN LUNCH




The museum and gardens are sited in Claverton Manor, a Grade I listed building competed in 1820 with a superb view of the Avon Valley. It is a short bus ride from the city.

The museum was founded by two antique collectors: Dallas Pratt an American psychiatrist from New York and heir to a substantial Standard Oil fortune, and his lifelong partner John Judkyn, a British designer and antiques dealer who took American citizenship.

The museum was opened in 1961 and remains the only museum devoted to American decorative arts outside the boundaries of the United States. The gardens around the house have been developed to include a replica of George Washington's garden at Mount Vernon, as well as a Lewis and Clark trail.

We will then travel down to the riverside and take lunch in the Bathwick Boatman on the edge of the city.



any of the City's Roman remains are centred around the Roman Baths. These include the archaeological remains of the Roman Temple of the Goddess Sulis Minerva built around AD 60 and the extensive bathing complex. This is at the heart of the UNESCO World Heritage site.

The Baths were for the public and based on a natural spring from some 4300 metres below the surface. Geothermal heat raised the water temperature to 80 degrees Celsius, providing 1.5 million litres of fresh warm water daily. The baths were in use until the Romas left about 500 AD.

We are very fortunate that by special arrangement we have been able to hold the Gala Dinner in this 2000-year-old Roman Baths and Pump Room complex. The reception will be held around the Baths. Here the stone floor is very uneven we suggest ladies wear flat shoes or bring a second suitable pair.

We will then move upstairs to the Pump Room for the Gala Dinner. This was built in 1799 by Thomas Balwin and John Palmer as a site for drinking the spring waters, which were claimed to have curative powers.







AIR

Bristol Airport is just 19 miles from Bath, making it the city's closest airport. It currently serves over 100 destinations worldwide.

RAIL


Bath Spa Railway Station is conveniently located in the heart of the city centre, just a short walk away from Bath's main attractions and shopping districts, including the historic Roman Baths and Thermae Bath Spa.

ROAD

Bath is located just ten miles from Junction 18 of the M4 motorway, which runs directly from London and Heathrow Airport. There are also excellent motorway links from the north and south of the country via the M5 motorway, and Wales is just a short drive west along the M4 motorway.

As Bath is a small city, the roads can become congested at busy times. To avoid traffic, parking charges and Bath's Clean Air Zone, use one of the city's three Park & Ride services.
