Thursday 11 July Trip to **Dumfries House**

Fabulous house previously owned by the Marquesses of Bute, designed by Robert Adam, rescued and restored under the patronage of HM The King. It houses the world's largest collection of Chippendale furniture.





The guided tour will be followed by lunch at the Laird's Table in the grounds of the nearby Craufurdland Castle

Diner Amical in the Kelvin Suite at the **Glasgow Golf Club**. The 9th oldest golf club in the world and set in beautiful grounds in the northern suburbs of the city.



Friday 12 July

Clyde estuary trip on the World's last seagoing **paddle steamer 'Waverley'** Down the River Clyde past Dumbarton, Dunoon and on to Rothesay on the Isle of Bute. With a gin tasting and lunch at Bute Yard in Rothesay before returning to Glasgow (all day).

Welcome Dinner in the Grand Hall of **Trades Hall** a superb building dating from 1605 and housing the 14 Trades (Guilds) of the city.

This will be held in the first public building designed by the world famous designer and architect Charles Rennie Mackintosh. Architect of the Glasgow School of Art and founder of the British Art Nouveau style.
